With a commendable performance, the team from our school qualified for the semifinal round of the prestigious 'Battle of Minds- Indian Army Quiz '. 32,000 schools of the country had participated in the online preliminary round of the Quiz. The landmark Indian Army Quiz was held to commemorate the 25th anniversary of India's victory in the Kargil War.

The team members Jeny Hinsu (Grade 10), Aarav Astu, Fazila Bharmal and Samrat Sinha (Grade 9) displayed amazing grit and gumption in the quarter finals round of the Quiz held at Pune, battling it out with top 40 schools, earning a spot in the semifinals. They gave a spirited performance in the semifinals held at Chennai in the month of December 2023, where they conceded their spot in the finals with a narrow margin. All the four students were awarded with a cash prize of Rs. 20,000 and a Samsung Tablet each.

## Future Classroom by LUXROBO, South Korea Driving Innovation



Our school has always been at the forefront in driving innovation in the classrooms and adopting the latest technological tools for making teaching and learning process engaging. The school has developed a Future Classroom cum Lab in collaboration with LUXROBO, a South Korean company that designs interactive Robotics and AI programming tools and modules. The Lab was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Benoy, CMI.

The introductory sessions for the Future Classroom were held in the school from 15th to 19th January, 2024 for the students and teachers of Grades 3 to 9. The students had great fun learning through the MODI (STEAM and AI) module and working with the 'Brick Pack Inventor' creating robots like Guide Bot, Bumper Car, Viking Ship, Spinner, Counting Bot, Earthquake Alarm and Spotlight among others.

## MERCADO 2023 Impacting Lives through Social Entrepreneurship!

MERCADO – a three days long social entrepreneurship programme cum trade fair was organized by the Commerce Department in the school from 30th September to 2nd October, 2023. Rev. Fr. Benoy, CMI inaugurated the trade fair. A shopping bazaar with more than 40 stalls was set up by the students offering a wide range of products.

The school hosted the 7th edition of its MUN Programme for the students of Classes 7 to 12 on 8th and 9th December, 2023. The programme was organized by the school in association with SkillSphere Education, a pan India educational enterprise that conducts various skillset development programmes for students.

The programme was inaugurated with the lighting of the lamp by the Chief Guest Prof. Arvind Akshan, HOD Physics, Christ College, Rajkot, Rev. Fr. James, Principal, Ms. Pranjali Magar from SkillSphere and one of the student representatives.

A 'Food Fair' was also organized on the occasion by the students and the entire proceeds were donated for a social cause.



## Annual Pauline's Day- Grade 1



The Grade 1 students showcased their learning during the Annual Pauline's Day held on 15th October, 2023. The young learners took their parents on a journey of the school through various knowledge stations. At the first station, the students presented basic parade drills. At the second station, aptly called 'The Wings of Imagination', the students worked in groups to create stories using materials like blocks, wooden houses, animals, puppets and different shapes. At the next three stations, the students explained the processes involved in the Warli art designs made by them on the walls of the school garden, the colourful sand art work created by them and the art of 'tie and dye' or 'bandhej' learnt by them prior to the event. The event began with a choreographed presentation on the transformation of water into its solid, liquid and gas form by the students. Each child wore a headgear resembling a water droplet.

The programme involved presentations on Rainwater Harvesting, Reverse Osmosis, Need for Water Conservation, Paper Marbling, Blow Art and Paper Mache activities. The students explained the aims, objectives and processes of each presentation to their parents. ## Annual Pauline's Day

### Grade 5

The showcasing event for Grade 5 was organized on 9th March 2024. A drama through poetry on the theme of 'Kindness' was presented by the students. The parents were given cards by the students with quotes on 'Kindness' and a message of 'Thank you for being kind.' 'Musical Jugalbandi'- a fusion of song, dance with traditional instruments like harmonium and tabla to the tune of classical musical hymns was presented by the students. The students created awareness on road safety through a skit titled 'Yamraj No Darbar' in Gujarati and a road safety song in Hindi. The Computer section offered tips on 'Internet and Online Safety'. The students also used Scratch Interface codes on topics like 'The Human Heart', 'Seed Dispersal', 'Conversation' and 'Math Calculator'. The Art section included paper rolling techniques to form captivating paper chains, natural line drawing and intricate pattern art. The students depicted landscapes, colourful clowns made of paper chains, dance forms like Kathkali utilizing cool, warm and complementary colour schemes.



## Annual Pauline's Day Grades 6 to 8



The students of Middle school had their Annual showcasing in the months of February and March 2024. During the Annual Pauline's Day for Grade 8, the students exhibited amazing Basketball and Football strategies through musical drill, presented dance dramas, recited Bhagvad Gita shlokas on Pakhavaj and displayed a unique rangoli of the State of Gujarat with various models like Gir forest, Statue of Unity, Amul Factory, Somnath temple, Rani ki Vav and Surat Diamond factory among others. The Physics station had the students explain the science behind simple machines, magnetic properties and force. Elements and compounds and basic chemical reactions were explained at the Chemistry station. The role of Data analysis and Geometry Basics formed part of the Maths station.

Chronological Thinking skills, Civic Responsibilities and Governance were highlighted at the History and Civics station. The concepts of Climate and Weather Awareness, Cultural Awareness, Diversity, Map Reading and Interpretation were highlighted at the Geography station.
